# Your Excellency,

We congratulate President El-Sisi on the representation of women within his government. We therefore respectfully request equal and visible representation of women leaders in the COP27 Presidency team. We also ask for a transparent decision process at the highest level to show that women's perspectives have been considered in the final decisions on climate negotiations. Diversity and inclusiveness are essential for COP27 to be a collective success and secure a brighter future for a **just environmental transition** for humanity on Earth.

We have actively reached out to the COP27 team, but no new women have been formally appointed as part of the COP27 Presidency high-level team - despite several female Egyptian Ministers that are well qualified - or at least this is not currently visible anywhere on the COP27 Presidency official website as of now.

We assembled a **COP27 Friends** group focusing on inclusiveness and diversity comprising women leaders from the region. They were ready to support the Climate Champions as well as the COP President. There have been a few exchanges with the Champions but the promise of a regular dialogue with the COP President has been very slow to get started - less than 100 days from the start of COP27.

We submit this open letter, as we did for the COP26 Presidency, for publication today at the end of the UN General Assembly and Climate Week on **September 27 in New York**. Our last <u>letter</u> was signed by over 400 influential women leaders and celebrities, and amplified by the Financial Times, Newsnight and the BBC and other significant global media outlets. Our social media campaign reached 154 million impressions.

#### Our asks to the COP27 Presidency in particular are:

1. The COP27 Presidency to list on its website all appointed leaders, Ministers, Ambassadors, and distinguished representatives who have now been appointed as part of the COP27 Presidency leadership team, in addition to the COP President, H.E. Shoukry and the High-Level climate champion Dr Mahmoud, and to make this list available online for transparency and accountability to all partners;

- 2. Assure and showcase a 50:50 balanced representation of men and women at the high-level team for COP27: embracing women's equal participation, supporting gender equality, and ensuring a transparent and accountable COP27 process:
- 3. Demonstrating global leadership by ensuring Egypt's updated Nationally Determined Contribution includes a gender analysis and commitment to tackling gender inequality via action on reducing emissions and calling on all Parties to do the same in line with the Lima Work Program on Gender established in 2014;

#### and our asks to the UNFCCC Parties:

- 1. Ensuring close to 100% of climate and nature positive finance is gender-inclusive and developing minimum standards to increase accessibility to finance for women-led and women's rights organizations that address climate change and other interrelated crises on the front lines, as an enabler of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development;
- 2. Phasing out fossil fuels and committing to net zero by 2050 and thus ensuring a just transition;
- 3. Including women in peace negotiations, because women empowerment, peace and conflict resolution and climate adaptation are inextricably linked.

We encourage you to act urgently on this fundamental gender balance crisis as the COP27 summit in Sharm-El-Sheik is less than 2 months away and are **very much open to dialogue with you** to give you some support and make some progress on this issue together in a collaborative way.

We would like to request a meeting with you and your Executive Office before COP27, and then in person at COP27.

We are already working well with the Champions Team on the preparation of the online Summit on November 4<sup>th</sup> and would be very much open to collaborating with you and your team for the preparation of the COP27 official events, including for the Leaders gathering and for the Gender day taking place during COP.

Please be assured that we all want to make COP27 a collective and inclusive success for the world.

We look forward to hearing from you and thank you for your consideration and response.
